### **'Bereza Kartuzka' in English (65 minutes)**

A WINNER of WorldFest International Houston Award 2010- REMI WINNER 43rd Annual WorldFest-Houston International Film Festival

"Bereza Kartuzka" tells the story of the infamous Polish concentration camp in which thousands of Ukrainian patriots were imprisoned between 1934-1939 . Former camp prisoners filmed in Canada, United States, Belarus, Poland and Ukraine provide first-hand accounts.

The film examines the political situation in the Western Ukrainian territories under Polish occupation between the First and Second World Wars. Events are portrayed through rare archival footage, historical photographs and commentaries by prominent historians and scholars.

Director Yuriy Luhovy is an award - winning filmmaker and member of the Academy of Canadian Cinema and Television whose other documentaries include: "Freedom Had A Price" , "Harvest of Despair", "Genocide Revealed"
