The IRC's mission is to provide comprehensive services to refugees, asylees, and humanitarian parolees, by assisting their integration and path to self-sufficiency. The IRC helps those in need to rebuild their lives and regain control of their future in their new community.

Refugee Resettlement

Each IRC resettlement office serves as a free, one stop center for refugees' needs during their pivotal first months in the U.S. Through a network of staff members and volunteers, the IRC helps refugees secure safe housing, learn about life and customs in America, apply for public benefits, enroll in school and ESL classes, secure jobs, and become citizens. We provide many of the basic things they need to restart their lives here and we help them overcome cultural barriers so that their adjustment is as easy as possible.



Humanitarian Parolees and Asylees

Asylees and humanitarian parolees are eligible for IRC services similar to those provided to refugees, including comprehensive case management, housing assistance, employment, education enrollment, and help accessing and navigating healthcare, as well as financial education and empowerment programs. IRC caseworkers work with asylees and humanitarian parolees on Individualized Services Plans (ISPs) to meet clients' needs. Some common needs include accessing affordable medical providers, legal services, and educational programs, specifically English as a Second Language (ESL) classes.
